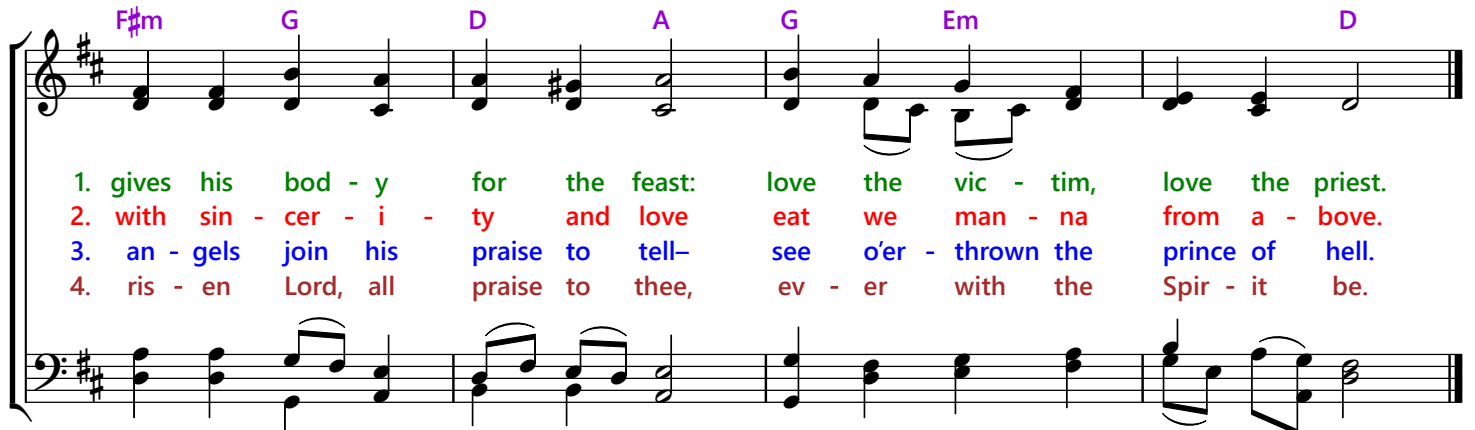
1. who hath washed us in the tide flow - ing from his pierc - ed side.
