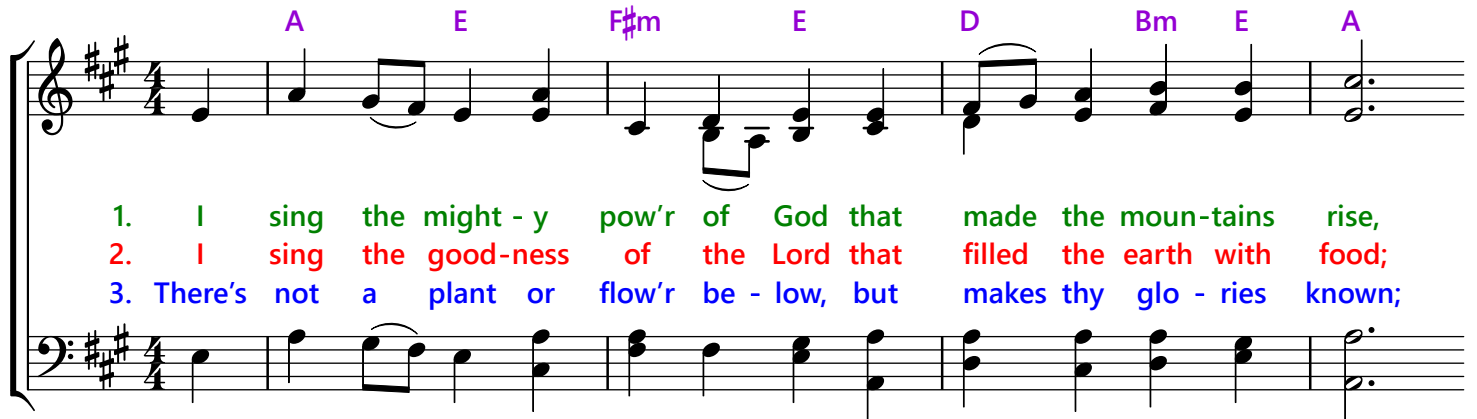

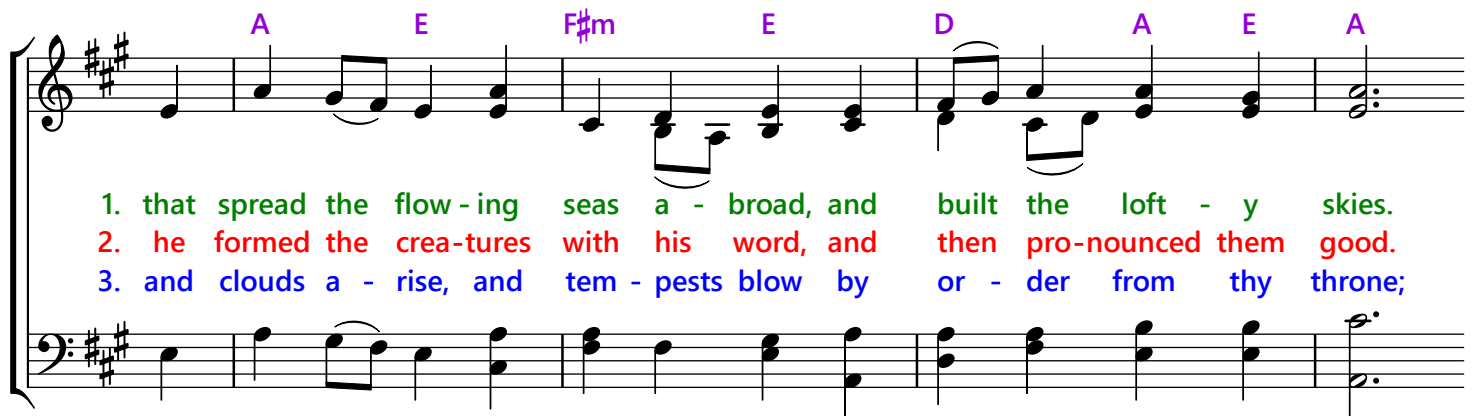

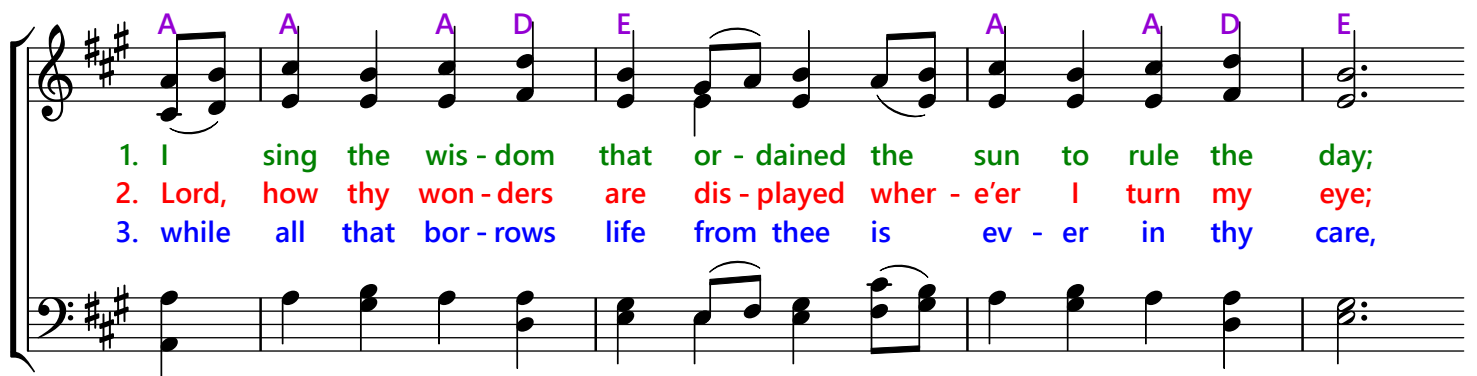
1. I sing the might - y pow'r of God that made the moun-tains rise,

A E F#m E D A E A



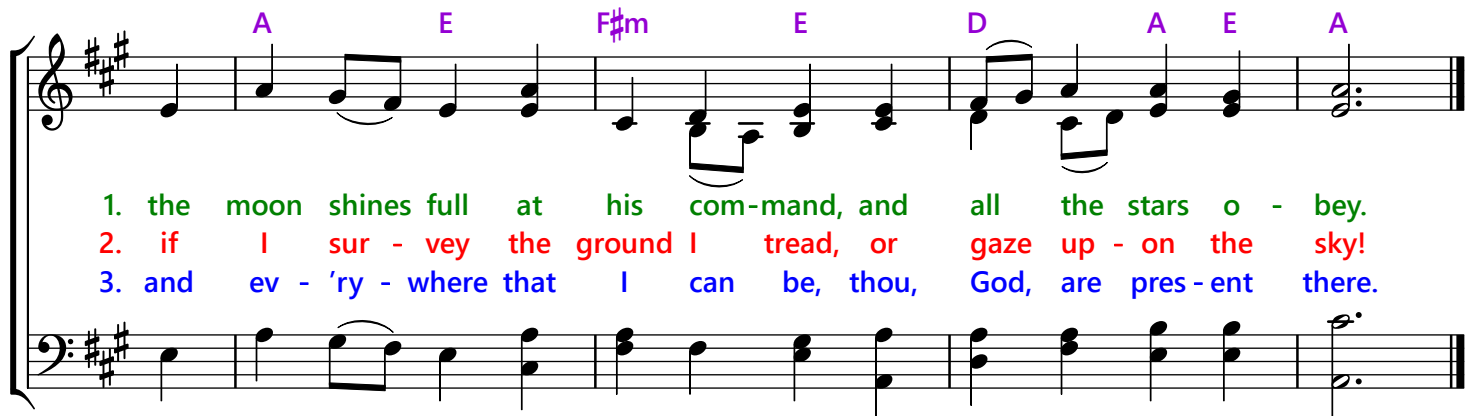
1. that spread the flow-ing seas a - broad, and built the loft - y skies.
