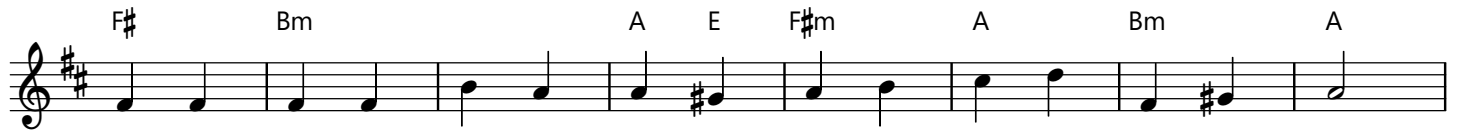


In His Temple Now Behold Him
