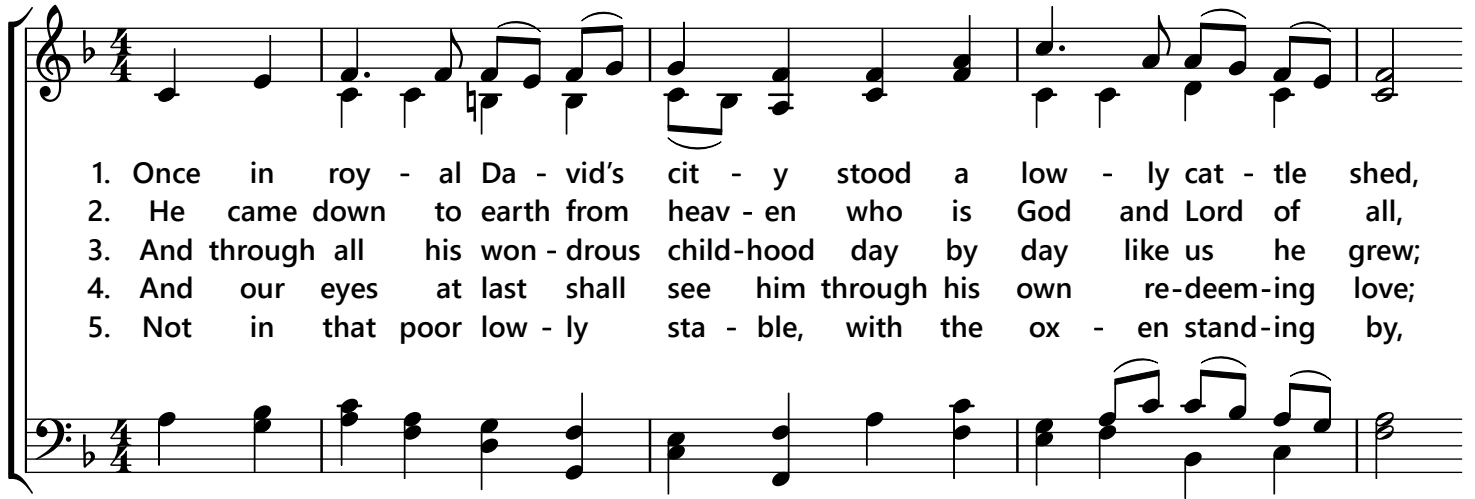


Once in Royal David's City

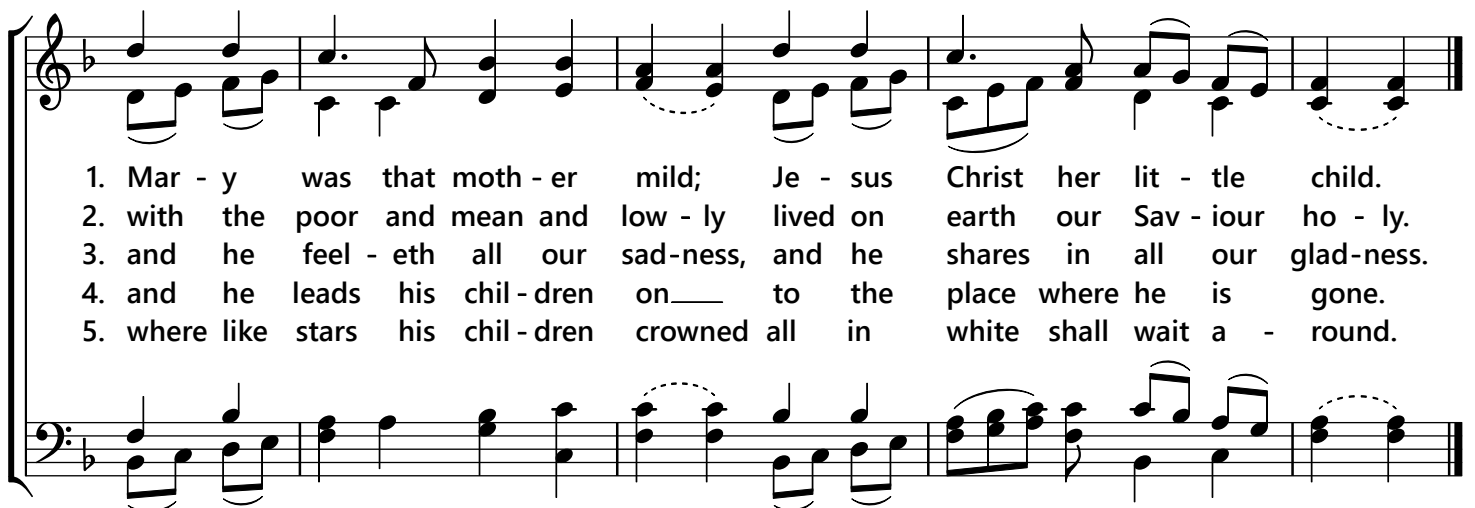
