Stanzas 5 and 6 are sung while the Blessed Sacrament is incensed.



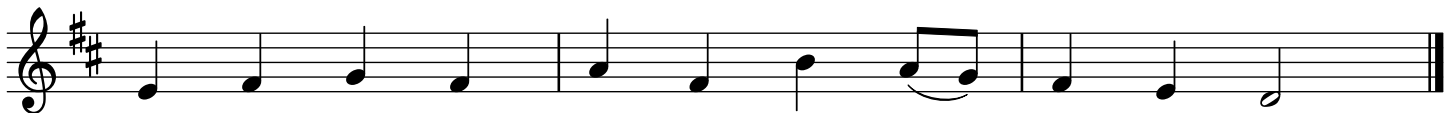
