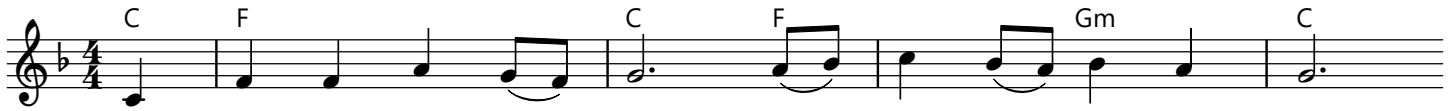


# The Advent of Our King
