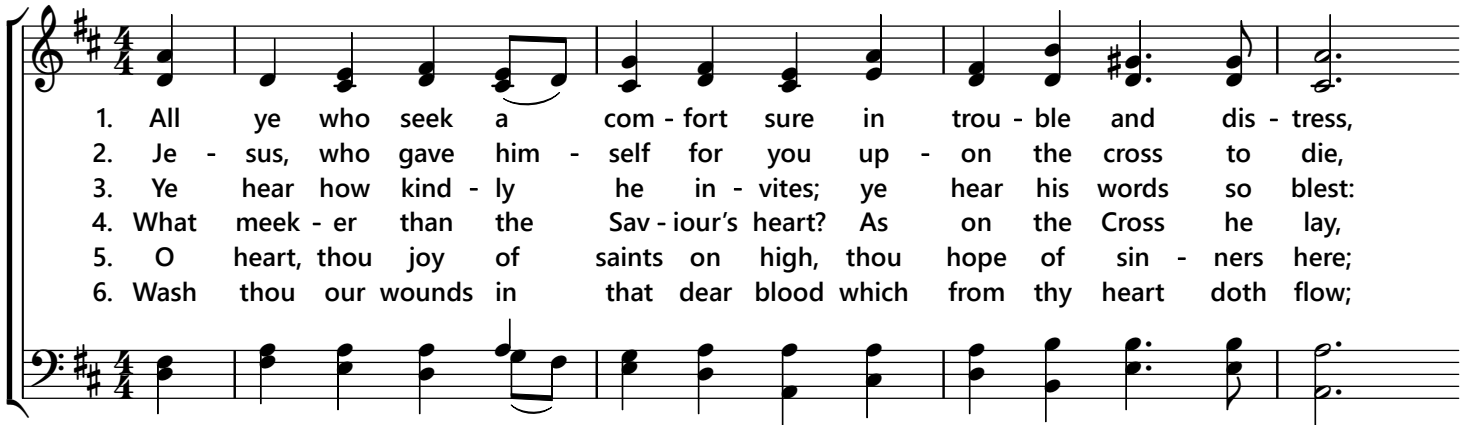


Quicunque certum quaertis
